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Origin of Sikhism

Sikhism began in the **15th century** in the **Punjab region** of South Asia (present-day Pakistan and India). It was founded by **Guru Nanak Dev Ji (1469–1539)**.

After Guru Nanak, **nine Gurus** followed, guiding the Sikh community over nearly **200 years**

Sikh Rule and the Sikh Empire

In the 18th–19th century, Sikhs established political power. **Maharaja Ranjit Singh** founded the **Sikh Empire**, ruling much of Punjab.

Modern Sikhism

Today, Sikhism is the **fifth-largest religion** in the world, with over **25 million followers**.

A Gurdwara is a holy place for Sikhs where they gather for congregational worship. The foundation of the first Gurdawara was laid by Guru Nanak Ji in 1521 at Kartarpur Sahib.

Nankana Sahib, the birthplace of Guru Nanak Dev Ji. Also, this is the place where Guru Nanak Dev Ji began preaching.

Sacha Sodha Gurdwara When Guru Ji was young, his father Mehta Kalu sent him to buy goods. Mehta Kalu wanted his son to learn about business. Guru Ji bought the goods and returned them. He fed the sadhus (holy men) at that place. Now, there is a beautiful Gurdwara where Guru Ji fed the sadhus. Maharaja Ranjit Singh built this Gurdwara. It looks like a fortress. Many people are attracted to its beauty, especially the Darshani Deorhi. Gurdwara

Rori Sahib Gurdwara Rori Sahib was built in a place where Gurunanak Dev ji was among the locals arrested by the Babars Army back in 1521. Here the Guru had to sit and lie on the hard bed of pebbles.

Kartarpur Sahib

Kartarpur Sahib holds deep historical significance as the final resting place of Guru Nanak Dev Ji. The tranquil Gurdwara Kartarpur Sahib, situated on the banks of the Ravi River, symbolizes unity and spiritual enlightenment. It is close to India Pakistan border and the largest Sikh commune commemorates annually. Guru Nanak Settled here with his family and is believed to have died when Kartarpur Sahib was built.

Panja Sahib Hassan Abdal

The shrine is associated with **Guru Nanak**, the founder of Sikhism.

Around **1521**, during his travels (Udasis), Guru Nanak visited Hasan Abdal. At that time, a local Muslim saint named **Wali Qandhari** lived on a nearby hill and controlled the only water source in the area.

According to Sikh tradition:

The local people were suffering due to lack of water. Guru Nanak asked Wali Qandhari for water, but he refused. Guru Nanak then moved a rock, and fresh water miraculously began flowing from the ground. Angered, Wali Qandhari rolled a large boulder down the hill toward Guru Nanak. Guru Nanak stopped the boulder with his hand. His **handprint (Panja)** was left imprinted on the rock

SIKH YATRA TO PAKISTAN



Day-01 (Lahore)

Arrival at Lahore , Transfer to designated hotel for rest , evening a sightseeing tour of Lahore , return to hotel for overnight stay.

Day-02 – Lahore – Nankana Sahib (01 Hour Drive)

After breakfast drive to Nankana Sahib to visit the birth place of Baba Guru Nanak (Janam Asthan) , full day worship , evening return to Lahore , Dinner and overnight at designated hotel.

Day-03 – Lahore

After Breakfast full day visit to Gurdwars including Dehra Sahib Sri Guru Arjan Dev and Samadhi of Maharaja Ranjit Singh Ji , evening return to Hotel for Dinner and overnight stay.

Day-04 - Lahore – Kartarpur (3-4 Hours Drive)

After breakfast Early morning Drive to Narowal to Visit Gurdwara Darbar Sahib Kartarpur , On arrival rest of the day worship , Evening return to Narowal for Dinner and overnight stay.

Day-05 –(4-5 Hours Drive)

After Breakfast Full day worship at Gurdwara Darbar Sahib , Evening drive to Islamabad , late evening, check in at hotel for overnight stay.

Day-06 (1 hour Drive)

Full visit to Panja Sahib Hasan Abdal , return to Islamabad for overnight stay.

Day-07

Full day at leisure for shopping and rest. Overnight at Hotel .

Day-08

Transfer to Islamabad Airport to fly back to Home destination.
